Area of Work

Why Education

Once, **Confucius** said, "If your plan is for one year, plant rice. If your plan is for ten years plant trees. If your plan is for one hundred years, educate children." **Literacy is the beginning of access to such a world of knowledge and freedom.** Development is quantitative change, which is always positive.



Extent of the problem

The number of teachers has gone up substantially and the average **Pupil-Teacher Ratio** comes close to the required levels. However, this does not solve the problem of quality. Large number of teachers are not qualified to teach, yet they are teaching. According to a rough estimate, out of 8 million teachers, around 1.4 million fall in this category.

Our Approach

BTCF works for education for underprivileged children who are under difficult circumstances. Special emphasis is given on girl education and women education, so that they and their families get empowered. BTCF goals to build pathways that bring student to school and ensure students learn at schools. Align with NEPS objective of developing 21st Century skills in adolescents. Strong Foundation initiative uses innovative and scalable solutions to help develop strong foundational learning skills like reading comprehension, writing ability, numeracy, and English speaking and critical abilities like self-expression, cognition, creativity, and gender sensitivity among children aged between 3-10 years living in the most marginalised geographies of India.

NEP 2020 aims to increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio in higher education including vocational education from 26.3% (2018) to 50% by 2035. **3.5 Crore** new seats will be added to Higher education institutions.

Health

Why Health

Time and health are two precious assets that we don't recognize and appreciate until they have been depleted. **Health is wealth.** Good health is the foundation of a thriving, progressive society. Health is important to live life to the fullest. When a person leads a healthy lifestyle, the body remains healthy and the mind is active and fresh. **Healthcare has become one of the largest sectors of the Indian economy**, in terms of both revenue and employment. Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity.

Extent of the problem

Government's goal is to increase public health spending to **2.5% of GDP**. Current health spending is only 1.15-1.5% of GDP. USA Health Expenditure is 18% of GDP. Per Capita Budget Expenditure on Health in India is among the lowest in the world. Health sector expenditure rose by 73% in 2021-22. The government expenditure on the health sector increased by 73% to 4.72 lakh crore in 2021-22, as compared to 2.73 lakh crore in 2019-20. The WHO prescribes a Doctor- Population Ratio of one for every thousand, but India is lacking in this ratio.

Spreading the awareness about the improving the Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn-Child and Adolescent Health among marginalised communities. Plant provide us with timber give shelter to animals produce oxygen we breath, protect soil so essential for growing crops, act as shelter belts, help in storage of underground water, gives use fruits, nuts, latex, turpentine oil, gum, medicinal plants and also paper that is so essential for your studies.



Extent of the problem

Earth has lost about 80 % of its native forests. **71%** earth is covered by water in which **68%** covered by sea and **3% on land**. Similarly, **29%** earth is covered by land. According to a recent **NITI Aayog report**, 21 Indian cities will run out of groundwater in coming years if usage continues at the current rate. The Sixth Assessment Report by **Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)** on Global warming at 1.5c temp propagates the need to strengthen and enhance existing coping capacity. According to **World Bank** report due to Environment Degradation India faces loss of Rs. 3.75 trillion per year that is 5.7% of GDP.

Development is a need of the society but it should be from environment perspective, development needs to be climate-smart. **Development that meets the need of the present generation without compromising the ability of the future generation to meet their own needs.** Energy Access has to be Affordable, Reliable, Sustainable, Modern.

When **84 %** of households in the country suffered a decline in their income in a year marked by tremendous loss of life and livelihoods, the number of Indian billionaires grew from 102 to 142, **Oxfam India's** latest briefing '**Inequality Kills**' has revealed. In India **2%** wealth is kept by **50%** people. **India's 1% richest people have total 58% India's wealth.** World's 8 top people keep 50% of world's wealth. In India, inequality, poverty is reason of lack of focus on social indicator.

Extent of the problem

Amongst multiple factors affecting people's health in rural areas, sanitation and nutrition play a crucial role. According to **UNICEF**, 1.2 million children's died in India who are below 5 year & 40% among them died in 4 weeks. 5.9 million children died in **India, Congo, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Pakistan.** **UNICEF** said **India & Nigeria** is economically strong but not able to reduce no of death. Landlessness, Empowerment, Size of families, Illiteracy, Poor Health/ Malnutrition, Child Labour, Helplessness, Inflation, Saturation are the Poverty Issues in India.

Our Approach

Agriculture

Why Agriculture

Once, **Mahatma Gandhi** said, "The future will belong to nations with grains, not guns." In India, Agriculture is biggest unorganized sector where **48.9%** population depends in India. In the year 2002, Agriculture is announced as **PMF (Prime Moving Force)**. **1%** land in agriculture leads **0.5 %** increases in industrial output and **0.7 %** increases in National income of India. According to recent **NABARD Survey**, an average monthly income of one rural household is 8059 rupee, from which **43%** income comes from agriculture and another **57%** income comes from daily labor work or government job. Means rather than farming, government need to provide another sources to farmers to increase income level.

Extent of the problem

Irrigation/ water management is also major problem in India as more than **60%** of irrigation water is consumed by two crops: **Rice** and **Sugar Cane**. India uses up to three times the water used to produce one tonne of grain in countries such as **Brazil, China**. In fact, **agriculture productivity in India is amongst the lowest in the world**. Land degradation and unsustainable agriculture practices have led to a loss of productivity which is fueling rural poverty. While farmers in irrigated areas earn 60 percent of their income from agriculture, farmers in rainfed areas earn only 20-30 per cent from farm-related activities. **Farm distress, agrarian distress** are the major agrarian projects in India.

Our Approach

Everything else can wait but agriculture cannot. It is time for a New India. **BTCF** aims to promote the awareness about Modern Irrigation Facilities. Also promote the need of **Seeds and Scientific and Modern Technological** knowledge that can help and guide in Reducing Costs. **BTCF** will help farmers to understanding a Rapid Transition to Cost-Effective **Organic Farming**.

Women Empowerment

Why Women Empowerment?

Once, **B R Ambedkar** said, "I measure the progress of a community by the degree of progress which women have achieved."
